As anaesthetists, we are uniquely positioned at the intersection of technology, physiology and critical decision-making, and this meeting provides an opportunity to thoughtfully examine how AI may enhance – and challenge – the future of our specialty.

Alongside this, we will explore advances in perioperative medicine and the ever-important field of obstetric anaesthesia, areas that both demand not only clinical excellence, but also communication, adaptability and compassionate care.

On Sunday, the focus shifts to practical skills and emergency preparedness through workshops in gastric ultrasound, anaphylaxis, paediatric can't intubate can't oxygenate (CICO), and acute severe behavioural disturbance. These sessions are designed to strengthen confidence and capability in high-stakes clinical moments where anaesthetists are often called upon to provide leadership, clarity and calm.

As always, the program has been designed to support meaningful continuing professional development while encouraging collaboration, discussion and reflection among colleagues from across Queensland and beyond.

We look forward to welcoming you to "The Sanctuary Symposium" – a meeting designed to inform, challenge and inspire, while celebrating the unique role anaesthetists play in creating sanctuary for patients, colleagues and each other.
