### Robert Orton Medal

#### 11. Robert Orton Medal

*The Robert Orton Medal was established by the Faculty of Anaesthetists, Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, in 1967 and represents the highest honour that the College bestows.*

- 11.1 The Robert Orton Medal (“this Award”) is made at the discretion of ANZCA Council.
- 11.2 This Award is given for distinguished service to anaesthesia, perioperative medicine and/or pain medicine.
- 11.3 “Distinguished service” is defined as service that is so notable or extraordinary that it sets the recipient apart from their colleagues; the service should occur above and beyond the clinical setting.
- 11.4 Eligibility for this Award is limited to current and retired fellows of the College.
- 11.5 All Award process and procedural instructions can be found in the Awards Process Document.
- 11.6 The college recognises the diversity of fellows, trainees and specialist medical graduates, all whose individuality, experience and breadth of practice contributes to a vibrant, inclusive and contemporary college. Our awards should reflect this as well taking into account qualities and achievements inclusive of equality, diversity, ethnicity, culture and location.
