Cecil Gray Prize

18. Cecil Gray Prize

The Cecil Gray Prize was established by the Faculty of Anaesthetists, Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, in 1961.

- 18.1 The Prize is open to candidates admitted to the final examination for Fellowship of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists.
- 18.2 The Prize shall take the form of a medal.
- 18.3 The Prize to be awarded at each examination shall be determined by the Council.
- 18.4 The Prize shall be awarded to the eligible candidate obtaining the highest marks, who shall have reached a standard considered by the examiners to be sufficiently high to justify the award of the Prize.
- 18.5 To be eligible, candidates must have passed all sections of the examination.
- 18.6 If two or more candidates are found to have reached the required standard and to have been allotted the same number of marks, being the highest obtained by any eligible candidate, it shall be open to the examiners to take such steps as they may think desirable to enable them to adjudicate in the matter. Joint award of the Prize may be considered.
